The Infrastructure Committee is an expert advisory committee established to provide advice to Council on the University's overall property strategy and master planning, and development and delivery of major capital projects to enable achievement of the University's overarching strategic goals.

3. Terms of Reference

The functions of the Infrastructure Committee are to:

- 3.1 Advise Council on the development and periodic review of the University's overall property strategy and master planning, and related campus development frameworks and principles (Our Campus 21st Century – 'OC21').

- 3.2 Provide advice to Council on strategies to leverage the University's significant property portfolio and approaches to procuring major infrastructure projects.
- 3.3 Receive regular reports from the Design Advisory & Review Panel and Landscape Advisory Group, and advise Council on the application of the University's built environment design principles and its consistency with the property strategy and campus development frameworks.

4. Frequency of Meetings

Four times a year, or as required.

5. Reporting to Council

The Chair will provide a written report to Council on the outcomes of matters considered by the Committee. The report will be considered at the first meeting of Council held after the Committee meeting. Council may refer reports from the Committee to other subcommittees of Council.
