

UTR6.109 - JOHN TYNDALL SCHOLARSHIP

Recitals-

- A. Dr. James Warne formerly of 116 Wellington Parade, East Melbourne, who died on 17 August 1958, bequeathed to the University the sum of £1000 to be applied "as the capital for a Scholarship in Physics at the University of Melbourne to be called the John Tyndall Scholarship in memory of the famous scientist John Tyndall".
- B. The University received the sum of £894 in satisfaction of the bequest, which sum increased to \$2,341 at 31 December 1994.
- C. In 2008 the research higher degree previously named the degree of master of Science was renamed the degree of master of Philosophy. From 2009 there will be two research higher degrees in the faculty of Science: the degree of master of Philosophy and the degree of doctor of Philosophy.

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The sum of \$2,341 and any accumulations and additions to the sum forms a fund called the "John Tyndall Scholarship" ("the fund") and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The annual value of the scholarship is the net annual income of the fund.
- 3. The scholarship is awarded to assist a student to carry out advanced studies and research in the University in the School of Physics.
- 4. A candidate for a scholarship must be enrolled in a research higher degree.
- 5. A person may be a candidate notwithstanding that he or she has been awarded some other prize, exhibition or scholarship in the University.
- 6. The scholarship is awarded annually by Council on the recommendation of the professors of Physics.
