

UTR6.126 – THE DOCTOR JOSEPH BIRCH HANSON PRIZE

Recitals-

- A. Louise Berta Mosson Hanson, formerly of Monaco, who died on 9 November 1962, bequeathed to the University the sum of £3,000 for the purpose of endowing a prize for the study of contemporary French poetry.
- B. The University received the sum of £3,000 in satisfaction of the bequest, which sum increased to \$13,799 at 31 December 1994.
- C. On 31 October 2002 the Attorney-General of Victoria made an Order concerning the subject of the prize that-

‘The prize is open to students enrolled in either MA or BA(Hons) and be awarded for distinction for either Contemporary French Literature or Poetry.’

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The sum of \$13,799 and any accumulations and additions to the sum forms a fund called the ‘Doctor Joseph Birch Hanson Prize’ (‘the fund’) and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The value of the prize is the net annual income of the fund.
- 3. The prize is awarded by the Council on the recommendation of the dean of the faculty of Arts to a student enrolled in the course for the degree of BA (Hons) or MA for distinction in the study of Contemporary French Literature or Poetry.
